

Dear Parents/Carers,

What a busy first few weeks of the new year at Staverton Primary School! It is lovely to welcome back Mrs Wookey to Sunflowers and Mrs Gresham to Roses.

The children have been learning how to speak out and keep stay safe this term. We watched the NSPCC video with Ant and Dec and learnt about Childline with Bluebells having a follow up workshop led by the NSPCC. We have also revisited our Safety Networks and Protective Behaviours with all the children in our classes. Later this month our focus will be Internet Safety culminating in Safer Internet Day on the 7th February where learning will be based around the theme 'Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online'. More details to follow!

I am pleased to say that I am now able to do referrals to the Mental Health Support Teams (MHST) and our Educational Mental Health Practitioner have been in school this week starting 1:1 weekly sessions with children. If your child is struggling with low mood and/or worry and you feel they would benefit from this additional support please do let me know.

We had a brilliant day at Young Voices in Birmingham this month and the children who took part were an absolute credit to our school! We sang our hearts out with over 6,000 children from other schools. Thank you to everyone who joined us for the performance in the evening.

We hope you enjoy learning a little more about our staff team at Staverton – Mrs James is starting the ball rolling!

We have been watching the birds come to the food and have been marking them off on a bird check list. We have also been using technology to make a bird nest. It was very colourful. We also made trees and a nest from Lego. We have been very creative this week with paper and scissors and have made beautiful butterflies and pictures of ourselves.

We have had a great start to the Spring term and getting used to the changes in the classroom. The children have adapted brilliantly and it's been great to be back! So far, we have been learning about Neil Armstrong and how his passion of flying led to him becoming an astronaut and making it to the moon. We will use some of this knowledge on our posters as part of our DT project. Some of our class were invited to a Boccia festival and they had a great time learning new skills and competing against other schools. We have also encountered an intruder in the classroom in the form of a purple Alien. This cheeky creature needed to be found so we have been writing character descriptions to help to try and locate him. The children have also been learning what it means to stay healthy and have been practicing how to feel their pulse to notice the difference before and after exercise.
