I would also like to thank Mr Lee for his amazing fundraising for The Umbrella Project by running 4 miles every 4 hours for 48 hours. The Umbrella Project is run by the ADHD Foundation to help raise awareness and understanding of neurodiversity. As well as in-depth teacher training, colourful umbrellas will be strung together in our school to create a unique visual display. Each display is designed to represent the one in five of us who have a neurodevelopmental condition, such as ADHD, Autism, Dyslexia, Dyscalculia or Tourette's syndrome. These conditions fall under the umbrella term of neurodiversity. We are looking forward to showcasing this in our school.

Finally, we are currently having some renovations work done and a new room is being built to support small group work for children and a quiet space for children to have support from our Mental Health Team. I will share photographs with you when it is finished.

Bluebells



In maths we have been recapping area and perimeter and have been learning how to accurately draw and interpret line graphs.
