Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to the final Newsletter of this academic school year. As one school year draws to a close and we start to prepare for a new school year, it is a time to reflect on all the wonderful things that have happened at Staverton Primary School this year.

We are immensely proud of the academic achievements of all our children this year:

- 71% of our children achieved a Good Level of Development in Reception
- 93% of our children in Y1 achieved the expected standard or higher in Phonics
- 83% of our children in Y4 achieved the expected standard or higher in the Multiplication Times Table Check
- 80% of our children in Y6 achieved the expected standard or higher in Maths, Reading and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling

The results above are truly results to be proud of and we are absolutely thrilled!. This is testament to the care, commitment and hard work of our incredible teaching team at Staverton Primary School and of course the hard work of all the children in our school.

However, not all things that happen in a school can be measured using data, and the attributes and dispositions that our children show each and every day linked to our school's values are something to behold. 'Big Friends' helping their 'Little Friends', Relationship Builders supporting children to build friendships and our School Council and Worship Leaders shaping our school with their wonderful ideas. Our commitment to inclusion and diversity continues to be at the heart of our school and we are committed to every child flourishing in our school.
