
Class News

Class One



Class 1 have been lucky enough to have our new pre-school cohort join us in the classroom this week. We are having lots of fun getting to know each other and reception have done a great job at modelling sharing resources and following daily routines. There has been lots of fine motor skill development activities to develop muscles for writing and sharing stories to notice similarities and differences. Reception have also been developing phonic knowledge in games.

Class Two



This week, Class 2 have been introduced to their new book- "George and the Dragon". They have been using their VIPERS skills to infer and make predictions about the book. They haven't been introduced to George just yet so he is hidden in the picture! Well done for another great week.

Class Three



We have been working hard to explore the value of numbers using counters, straws, place value arrows and base 10. We can write numbers up to 1000 and the year 4 children have even explored larger numbers. We have also started our Literacy text "the elves and the shoemaker". We have generated vocabulary and make inferences about character emotions.

Class Four



In English this week, we have started exploring what makes a really good diary entry and have begun practising writing diary entries using our grammar skills. In PSHE this week, Class 4 took part in the BBC's live lesson: Bouncing back to class. We heard about how to build our resilience and the five key ways to look after our wellbeing.
