Class One




This week in Class 1 we have been sharing the story 'Toys in space'. We thought about the vocabulary in the book and generated some super synonyms for the word 'big'. We created some 'missing' posters for the alien's lost toy and have been practising using our phonic skills to write independently. We thoroughly enjoyed our Forest school session this week and the children have been singing beautifully in preparation for performing our Easter songs.

Class Two



This week we started with our world book day celebrations based on Monkey Puzzle by Julia Donaldson. The children worked on skills to write their own poems and art work based on habitats. The art work had a twist as they had to merge their ideas with their partner to have animals in a strange habitat.

Class Three



Class 3 this week have combined their learning about Electricity in Science to create buzz wire games. Children have researched toys at home during remote learning and designed their shapes and backdrops for their games last week. We have spent the afternoon creating circuits, shaping wire and testing our new games.

Class Four



This week in Class 4, we have been trying out New Age Kurling. The children took part in three games that tested their accuracy, aim and distance judging skills. A great time was had by all. In maths, we have been exploring how to find the area and perimeter of triangles and irregular shapes.
