Poppies have had an exciting term exploring the theme 'frozen planet'. The weather has certainly been in our favour for that!

We've learnt all about animals that live in the South Pole with a particular focus on Penguins and the Oliver Jeffers book 'Lost and Found'. We have explored ways of melting ice and linked this with melting chocolate. Yum!!

We've also helped our local birds this season by making bird feeders using toilet rolls, seeds and peanut butter. They were very popular particularly with two very cheeky squirrels!



This term the children have been put into different phonics groups. It has been an absolute pleasure to see each and everyone of them thrive in their new groups with all children in Reception now writing independently.

In Maths we have started using part whole models to look at making numbers to 5 and this will continue over the next few weeks with numbers to 8.


Sunflowers

We have had a great start to 2024 in Sunflowers' Class! In English, the children have loved reading all about Pete the Badger in our text 'Tidy'. They all produced some amazing writing based on this about how we can keep our school tidy. We have also really been enjoying reading our class book 'Lizzie and Lucky: The Mystery of the Missing Puppies' and cannot wait to find out what happens in the end!


In Maths, the children have been working on their understanding of equal groups, arrays and repeated addition, with the children in Year 2 linking this to multiplication.

Our Geography lessons have continued to focus on the UK with the children looking at some of the key landmarks in Northern Ireland, Wales, England and Scotland. In Science, the children have loved looking at different materials and testing their properties. They especially loved using water to see if materials were waterproof or not!

In DT we have been looking at the structure of a Ferris Wheel and are very excited to build our own soon.



Roses



We have had a super start to the new year, and we have all been working very hard. In English we have written a diary focusing on the text 'Queen of Darkness.' Our class reader this term is 'Podkin one-ear,' which we are very much enjoying. In Maths we have been focusing on multiplication and division.

We have been incredibly busy with our swimming lessons every Wednesday and our Samba drumming on a Thursday. The children are thoroughly enjoying the sessions and are making amazing progress.

In DT this term we are working towards making slingshot cars and in science we are focusing on electricity.

Our history focus is The Romans and we have started learning about Boudicca and how the Romans invaded Britain.



Bluebells

In Bluebells class we have had a great start to 2024! We have been getting into our new English Text – Orphans of the Tide by Struan Murray, we are particularly enjoying the mysterious and enthralling events that are taking place in the 'last city in the world'.

We have been having lots of fun completing a range of practical experiments in Science and have investigated;

- How an object's mass affects gravity by dropping paper cups of different weights and seeing which hit the ground first
- How parachutes increase air resistance by giving toy figures a gentler landing
- How streamlining reduces drag in water
- How the surface affects friction and therefore the speed of a car on a ramp



Thank you to everyone who sent in recycling ready for our DT project. The children have worked hard over the last couple of weeks designing their playgrounds and this week we have started to build the structures with the cardboard and other junk modelling items.
