We had our very first MacMillan Coffee Afternoon which was a roaring success! During our Tuesday Trekker walks we have been exploring signs of Autumn. We have explored the 'helicopter' seeds from a sycamore tree and have spotted berries for the birds to eat.

Our biggest success this month is our phonics. We are now officially readers and writers!!! We have loved writing about our story 'On the way home' and have even written independently in our free time.

We have finished the term with a Prince and Princess day which has included castle making, cutting Rapunzel's hair, exploring Cinderella's pumpkin, crown making, necklace making and much much more. I think you'll agree , we all looked amazing!



Sunflowers

We have had another great few weeks in Sunflowers' Class. The children have all worked really hard.

We have really enjoyed learning all about living things in Science this term and loved going outside to look for different animals that we could find in Autumn/Winter time.

We also had LOTS of fun making our windmills in DT this term and the children all did an amazing job.

In History, we have learned all about Neil Armstrong and the Apollo 11 mission. The children were all amazed when we tried to make the height of the Saturn 5 rocket (111m) on the field.

In English, the children have really enjoyed our key text 'Aliens Love Underpants' and have created some amazing writing based on this.

Another highlight of our term was meeting all of the amazing animals that Dave brought in to show them.



Roses



We have had a fantastic first half-term in Roses and have had lots of fun in our learning!

A highlight of our term was the visit from Dave and his animals when the children got to meet lots of interesting creatures!

We have continued our learning of Portal Stories in English and role played going back into time to tell a recount of our experiences. We have enjoyed our class text - 'Omar - Accidental Trouble-Maker'. The children have used this to inspire further recount writing as well as further our understanding of different faiths and relationships. In Maths we have looked at lots of different strategies for addition and subtraction. History has been particularly exciting, and we have acted out hunting and gathering as Stone Age people, made a model Stonehenge from biscuits, built straw shelters and created some Stone Age inspired artwork. Our learning in Science has continued and we have looked at how distance affects volume and designed scientific investigations to explore this.

I'm sure you will agree that the children have worked incredibly hard and have lots of new knowledge! Well done, Roses!



Bluebells



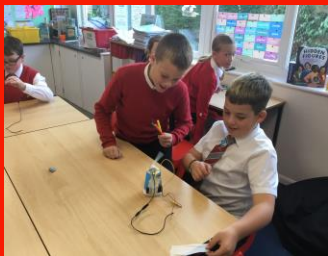
What a busy term we have had! The children have all worked incredibly hard and had lots of enjoyable experiences in their learning.

In Science, the children have learnt all about the circulatory system, they have experimented with the effect of exercise on their heart rates and dissected a pig heart to identify the different parts.

In DT, the children created 'Doodlers' using electrical circuits, they showed real perseverance! All of the children enjoyed the visit from Dave with his animals and learnt so much.

I think you will all agree that the children did an amazing job in leading the Macmillan coffee afternoon. The children represented our school perfectly and displayed our school values throughout the afternoon. We were all very proud of them!
