Where should I park?



Key

- DO NOT park in this area
- OK to park in this area

Ideally you should park on Daventry Road or Braunston Lane (the areas marked green on the map)

PARKING

Safe parking is in line with our School Charter →

- We have the right to be safe.
- We have the responsibility to act safely on our own and with others.

The safety of our children is paramount. With the shorter daylight hours that winter brings, children are arriving and leaving school in low-light conditions, adding an extra challenge to keeping children safe on the roads.

Deaths and accidents on our roads	On our roads in 2014:
85,814 child injuries on roads within a 500m radius of schools in the period 2007 to 2013, the equivalent of 1190 per month.	2029 Children Seriously injured
Only 1 in 5 schools had no children injured in accidents within that distance over the same period.	53 Children Killed
	20% of these happen going to/from school.

One way of preventing accidents on the road is considerate and safe parking:

The highway code, which we should all know as drivers, states that:

You **MUST NOT** wait or park, or stop to set down and pick up passengers, on school entrance markings... (Rule 238)

DO NOT stop or park:

- near a school entrance
- opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space
- in front of an entrance to a property
- on a bend. (Rule 243)


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Did you know?

Poppies have had an amazing start to their first term for many at Staverton Primary school. This term all of our learning is linked around story telling and fairy tales. We have been learning lots of Nursery Rhymes and are enjoying our class text *George and the Dragon*. A huge hit in the classroom has been our dressing up basket. The children have enjoyed playing different characters and replicating this in the small world area.

The children have made lots of new friends in the first few weeks and it has been a pleasure to see their writing progressing in phonics already.

Sunflowers

The children in Sunflowers' Class have had an amazing first few weeks and have settled in really well.

In English, we have been writing sentences based on our text 'The Darkest Dark' which the children have really enjoyed. They have created some amazing sentences about our text and have been working really hard on their letter formation. We also loved creating our own planets using paint and sponges.

Our maths lessons have been centred around place value and consolidating the children's understanding of numbers up to 20. The children have particularly enjoyed doing some active learning in our maths lessons.

In science, we have been looking at living things and learning how to group animals. We also learned about the structure of different animals and how they are different.

In history, we are learning about Neil Armstrong and the time that he lived in. The children loved doing our 'art gallery' activity to explore what the 1960s was like.



Roses


Roses have settled in very well ! Year 4's have delighted me with how mature and hard-working they are and Year 3 have made a fantastic start to Key Stage Two!

We have had lots of fun writing Portal Stories in English and the children are showing great imagination in their writing.

We have also been learning lots of interesting facts about The Stone Age period and where this fits into British chronology – the children have been archeological super sleuths investigating prehistorical artefacts and finding out what they tell us about Stone Age life.

Science has been lots of fun too! We have been learning about Sound – we have investigated how vibrations create sound waves and have experimented with string telephones to see how this works in practice. We have also investigated how different pitches are created and explored how musical instruments produce different sounds. We have also been keeping active in our PE lessons learning new ball skills and playing invasion games.

Bluebells have made a fantastic start to the new school Year. It has been an incredibly busy few weeks!


